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A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

"for the first time in my life, I got my foot caught in the door"

The Music Man hit the Broadway stage in 1957 and quickly became an American classic. It won five Tony Awards, including the Tony for Best Musical, beating out West Side Story for that title. The Music Man cast album was number one on the Billboard charts for 245 weeks, and the show ran for 1,375 performances.

No surprise that in 1962, *The Music Man* became a movie. Robert Preston, who was Broadway's original Harold Hill, reprised the role for the movie. Shirley Jones (later to become TV's Mrs. Partridge) played Marian Paroo, and Ron Howard, who starred in *Happy Days*, and directed movies including *Apollo 13*, *How the Grinch Stole Christmas*, and *A Beautiful Mind*, played Winthrop Paroo.

The show's success led to several revivals, including a long-running 2000 Broadway revival, a 2003 television adaptation that starred Matthew Broderick as Harold and Kristen Chenoweth as Marian. Most recently, *The Music Man* returned to Broadway in 2022 with Hugh Jackman and Sutton Foster leading the production.

The first time I worked on *The Music Man* was in 1974, as its choreographer. Since then, I have been involved in at least six or seven more versions of the show (seriously, I have lost count!).

My fondest memories of *The Music Man* always include John Healy. I worked with him for almost 25 years. He was a mix of Harold Hill and P.T. Barnum. His enormous love of Musical Theatre was inspiring for thousands. I continue to carry his torch, (as do others), and continue to be grateful for his vision, enthusiasm, and expertise.

My other real life Music Man is my brother Rick. For years he inspired many of EDMT's youngest performers by writing the scripts for and directing our Training Show program, which launched many of those young people into years of performing with EDMT. Rick possesses attributes of Harold Hill and has rallied thousands in the marching band world to reach fantastic goals. And, every time I see a marching band uniform, I think of him. This one's for you, Rick.

I love the story of *The Music Man*. It is a story of redemption, surrender, and new beginnings. The transformations that occur in River City are nothing short of miraculous. What begins as a con turns out to be a beautiful gift.

Welcome to *The Music Man*. It's 1912, and the good people of Iowa have a story to share with you.

Thank you for being here.

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
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
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STAFF BIOGRAPHIES

Debbie Wilson ARTISTIC DIRECTOR/DIRECTOR

One of the founders of EDMT, Debbie has been the artistic director for twenty years, and has led EDMT to become one of the premier musical theatre companies for youth in the Western United States. She has further helped performers obtain crucial skills by founding EDMT's Performing Arts Institute in 2003.

While musical theater is Debbie's first love, she has wide-ranging experience including large-scale choreography for events ranging from the Olympics and Superbowl to the World Cup, Pro Bowl, and San Francisco Black and White Balls.

In theater, she has performed in, directed and/or choreographed hundreds of productions including: 42nd Street, Pippin, Oklahoma!, Thoroughly Modern Millie, Peter Pan, Seven Brides for Seven Brothers, West Side Story, Chicago, Follies, Les Misérables, A Chorus Line, Hairspray, and Anything Goes with Chita Rivera.

Debbie is the recipient of sixteen regional theatre awards for choreography, direction, and performance. She has been honored by the Interfaith Bureau of Sacramento and the California Assembly for her work with young people.

Her students have gone on to perform on Broadway, in national tours, in international concert tap companies, modern dance companies, on cruise ships, and in TV and film.

Debbie taught for American Musical Theater of San Jose and was dance chairperson for the professional training and summer youth programs for twenty years. She also headed the dance department at Lincoln High Performing Arts Magnet. She has taught for many prestigious youth organizations and has been recognized repeatedly for her excellence and contributions to youth.

Debbie is proud to be a founder of El Dorado Musical Theatre and its artistic director. She lives in El Dorado Hills with her daughter Anjie Rose and her son Zachary.

Anjie Rose Wilson associate artistic director/choreographer

Anjie went to her first EDMT rehearsal the day after she turned six and this year marks her 20th year with EDMT. Dedicated to dance, Anjie Rose Wilson has studied jazz, tap, ballet, hip-hop, and lyrical styles for over eighteen years.

Before becoming the company's primary choreographer, Anjie had been apprenticing for years as the assistant choreographer and associate choreographer for almost twenty EDMT Main Stage, Rising Star, and Encore productions as well as for EDMT's tour group High Voltage. *The Music Man* marks the tenth EDMT Main Stage production Anjie has choreographed. She has been on staff for EDMT's training shows for twelve years and now runs the program as the artistic manager.

Anjie has been an instructor for EDMT's Performing Arts Institute since 2012 and she teaches a range of ages. Her classes challenge even the more seasoned performers and the fittest young dancers. Some might refer to her classes as "dance boot camp." She has gone to New York City to participate in the audition-only Rockette Summer Intensive for four years. Starting from its inception, Anjie spent eight years as a member of El Dorado Musical Theatre's Tour Group, High Voltage, and now cochoreographs their shows.

Anjie has been in 50 EDMT productions in roles such as Dolly Levi/Hello, Dolly!, Morticia Addams/The Addams Family, Sharpay Evans/Disney's High School Musical, and The Ghost of Christmas Future/A Christmas Carol.

Chris Meissner VOCAL DIRECTOR

Chris last performed with EDMT in 2011's *Curtains*, and is thrilled to be back with the company as Vocal Director for *The Music Man*.

Chris is a graduate of UCLA, where he received his Bachelor of Arts in Theater. His professional credits include DTLA's *Carrie* (Ensemble), *Frozen - Live at the Hyperion* (Olaf), *Grease: Live! on FOX* (Ensemble), and San Francisco Symphony's *West Side Story: In Concert* with Cheyenne Jackson (Baby John) - the Grammy nominated cast album of which is available everywhere music is streamed. He is blessed to have worked under the direction of creative titans like Michael Tilson Thomas, Tom Kitt, and Tommy Kail. He has written two ten-minute musicals for the Festival of New American Musicals's *ShowSearch* competition (mentored by 35mm's Ryan Scott Oliver and *Avenue Q's Jeff Marx*). Chris enjoys playing guitar, shooting and developing film photography, and producing videos for his community of artists (portfolio at chrismeissner.com).

Chris is proud of this cast for tackling a monumental, 300-page score. He especially enjoyed working with The Quartet as he sang a cappella with the UCLA ScatterTones. He thanks his friends and family for their love and support and dedicates this show to the community of El Dorado Hills.

Karen McConnell costume designer

Karen has been a part of the El Dorado Musical Theatre's team since 2006. She was involved on a volunteer basis for many years, working as a stagehand, sewing, costuming for High Voltage and working as assistant costumer on many productions including *Cats, Shrek The Musical*, and *The Wizard of OZ*. She took on the role of costume designer in 2016 with EDMT's *Disney's Alice in Wonderland JR*. Since that time she has created costumes for shows including 42nd Street, Bye Bye Birdie and Disney's Beauty and the Beast. She loves to add glitter and sparkle and her signature tiny details called 'Lobby Candy' that can only be seen when you meet the actors close up.

Karen owned the award-winning children's boutique, Starlight Starbright, for 14 years and just recently retired. She studied voice at the University of Michigan and the University of Arizona and is a classically trained soprano. She performs with the Sacramento Choral Society and Orchestra throughout the year.

Karen has been married for over 35 years, is mother to two amazing women, mother-inlaw to an outstanding U.S. Naval Nuclear Engineer, and 'Mimi' to two gloriously giggly granddaughters.

Zach Wilson TECHNICAL DIRECTOR

Zach has been EDMT's projection designer/programmer for the past ten years, and is now the company's set designer and technical director. Zach has worked on the technical aspects for many EDMT shows such as *The SpongeBob Musical*, Roald Dahl's *Matilda The Musical*, *Disney's The Little Mermaid*, *Peter Pan*, *Disney's Beauty and the Beast*, *Mary Poppins*, *Shrek The Musical*, and High Voltage cabarets.

Zach can be found in roles both off and on the stage. During his 17 years with EDMT, he has performed in 53 EDMT shows. Some of his favorite roles include Topher/Cinderella, Sheldon Plankton/The SpongeBob Musical, Miss Trunchbull/Roald Dahl's Matilda The Musical, Riff/West Side Story, Beast/Disney's Beauty and the Beast, Bert/Mary Poppins, Shrek/Shrek The Musical, Ebenezer Scrooge/A Christmas Carol, and Ebenezer Scrooge/A Christmas Carol. Zach is a member of EDMT's tour group High Voltage and is now in his 13th year with the group.

He has been taking on more roles to refine his expertise through assistant directing, various workshops, and as an acting instructor with the Performing Arts Institute.

Zach has a passion for both the onstage and the technical art forms, and plans to keep doing it all!

The Gypsy Robe has been a Broadway tradition since 1950. The garment is considered magical and brings with it luck, tradition, and a sense of community.



EDMT adopted the tradition in 2006. Our tradition, as on Broadway, is for the robe to be presented on opening night before curtain time. A new member of the chorus is crowned the new king or queen of the gypsies!
