Artistic Director

Jennifer Reason is a long-time singer with RSVP. She has extensive experience in the choral field and is an accomplished pianist and performer. Ms. Reason recently made her international conducting debut in St. Peter's Basilica, Vatican City, as part of the Festival of Peace and Brotherhood. She previously

oversaw the founding of the choral arts program at George Washington Carver School of the Arts in Sacramento, and was also a founding member of Sacramento State's award-winning vocal jazz ensemble, C-Sus. (Downbeat Award: Best Collegiate Vocal Jazz Ensemble, US/Canada.) For the last five years, she has enjoyed being a member of the artistic staff with the Sacramento Children's Chorus.

A widely versatile performer, Ms. Reason has shared the stage with many diverse acts including classical heavyweights Hope Briggs (San Francisco Opera), Steven Mackey (Composer in Residence, Princeton) and Holly Stell ("Little Pavarotti"); Broadway stars Faith Prince (Tony Award), Eugene Brancoveanu (Tony Award) and Jason Graae; rockers Jonathan Cain (Journey), Michael Carabello (Santana) and Jerry Martini (Sly and the Family Stone); and popular personalities such as Billy Bob Thornton and baseball's Tony La Russa. She has also appeared in solo and ensemble performances throughout Europe, the United States and Canada. Recent engagements include the Schlern International Music Festival in Italy, the Inter-Harmony International Music Festival in Germany, the Festival of Peace and Brotherhood in Italy, and appearances at Carnegie Hall and the Liszt Academy in Hungary.

Ms. Reason is a founding member of the modern chamber ensemble, Citywater—currently Ensemble in Residence at CSUS. She earned her Bachelor of Music in Piano Performance at CSUS under the tutelage of Steinway Artist Richard Cionco. Upcoming projects include a return to Carnegie Hall as well as appearances at the Orfeo International Music Festival in Italy and the Valhalla Music Festival in Tahoe.

Alpha K9 is a combat-disabled veteran-run non-profit organization. Our mission is to save lives, one dog at a time, by providing highly skilled and effective service dogs to those whose lives depend on them. We provide specially trained dogs with excellent temperament to veterans who suffer from post traumatic stress disorder (PTSD), families and organizations assisting in public safety.

WHY ALPHA K9

According to the Veterans Administration, 10.6 million veterans overall live with combat-related PTSD. Of the vets who served in Iraq and Afghanistan, 30% or 834.463 suffer from the disorder.

In 2009 Kevin Cameron, CEO, discovered that service dogs cost veterans \$9000-\$25,000 each. None of the expenses were covered by insurance, and there was a two year waiting list. The application process required full disclosure of the medical history, including events leading to the cause of PTSD, yet strict guidelines for use of this information were not in place. Training methods were impractical. Plus, the dog had to be returned without refund if the patient were deemed cured of PTSD at any point.

NON-PROFIT BENEFITS

Alpha K9 is dedicated to the community. In 2013 we launched 'Operation Warrior' geared towards local high school seniors. Students were paired with dogs and taught service dog training. Of the 19 dogs, 17 passed Alpha K9 standards and were placed with candidates in need.

Alpha K9 hosts 'Service Dog Hour' where teams (handler and dog) come to hone their training or simply relax in a place where they feel safe and comfortable.
