ACT ONE: Village Scene

Old Dr. Coppélius has spent his life developing his mystical powers, which sometimes work—but more often, don't! His greatest ambition is to bring to life Coppélia, one of the mechanical dolls that he has made. No one in the village knows what Dr. Coppélius does in his workshop, but the noises and explosions from his mysterious house often give cause for alarm.

Dr. Coppélius puts Coppélia out on a balcony and is delighted when everyone mistakes her for a real person. But Swanilda, a young lady who lives across the street, is not so pleased when Coppélia ignores her—especially since Swanilda's sweatheart, Frantz, gets plenty of Coppélia's attentions. Worried by Frantz's interest in Coppélia, Swanilda asks an ear of wheat to tell her if her sweetheart is true to her. The wheat, the object of an "he loves me/he loves me not" interrogation, suggests through its silence that Frantz does indeed love another. Frantz protests this and storms off angrily.

After everyone has departed, Swanilda's friends find a key that Dr. Coppélius has accidentally dropped, and they sneak into Dr. Coppélius' house to look for the mysterious girl from the balcony.

Frantz has the same idea.

ACT TWO: Dr. Coppélius' Workshop

Inside the mysterious workshop, Swanilda and her friends finally discover Coppélia, and are astonished to find that she is only a doll. Dr. Coppélius returns and drives the girls out, but Swanilda hides in the cupboard and takes Coppélia's place.

Franz appears, and Dr. Coppélius threatens to punish him for trespassing. Instead, Dr. Coppélius seizes the opportunity to try to extract the boy's spirit and use it to bring Coppélia to life. He gives Frantz a sleeping draught in a cup of wine and the boy promptly falls asleep. Dr. Coppélius uses a book of magic to attempt his spell.

Swanilda, dressed as the doll, pretends to come to life. The old man is delighted, but becomes alarmed when "Coppélia" gets out of hand. To keep her occupied, Dr. Coppélius teaches her a Spanish dance and a Scottish dance. Finally, Frantz wakes up and Dr. Coppélius discovers that he has been tricked: Coppélia is still only a doll, after all.

PAMELA HAYES

Artistic Director

Born in Yorkshire, England, Pamela trained with Dorothy Stevens, a major examiner for The Royal Academy of Dance. Gaining her examinations and membership into the academy, Pamela continued her training when she received a scholarship to attend the world famous Royal Ballet School in London. Her professional career began on the stage at The Royal Opera House Covent Garden where she also had the opportunity to perform with The Royal Opera Ballet. Arriving in America, Pamela danced with Oregon Ballet Theatre, Ballet West, Tulsa Ballet Theatre, Eugene Ballet, Pacific Ballet Theatre and Ballet Oregon.

During her successful performing career, which took her all over the world, Pam danced many leading roles including Sugar Plum Fairy, Snow Queen, Rose Queen, Cinderella, Sleeping Beauty and Swanilda in *Coppélia*.

This love for the classical ballet continued when she began teaching young students and realized how important this foundation was for their training. Passing on the knowledge she had taken for granted, Pam bases her teaching in a strong anatomical foundation, carefully guiding each student with their individual needs and sometimes limitations, and believing that strong, solid clean technique can often lift a modestly-talented dancer beyond their initial expectations. Her teaching has been recognized for its cleanliness, purity and attention to detail, both artistically and anatomically.

Pamela is very proud to present the Pamela Hayes Classical Ballet Theatre, which under her artistic direction continues to bring classical ballets of the highest quality to our local community.


