THEATER ETIQUETTE

Arrive early: to avoid being late, plan to arrive 30 minutes early. Sometimes unexpected circumstances make it impossible to arrive on time. However, if you arrive late, you must wait patiently until there is a break in the act or performance. Do not argue with the ushers about having to wait, they are just doing their jobs.

If the house lights flash, the show is about to begin, please take your seat. Lights will dim just before a performance, then go dark. Show your sophistication by sitting calmly.

At most performances, you will receive a printed program. Be sure to arrive early enough to read the program, so that you will have an idea of what to expect in the show. Also, you will find the names and information about people who are performing and helping to put on the show. Read the credits to learn more about the people and the performance. It will make the show more enjoyable and you'll learn things that might surprise you.

Go easy with the atomizer: many people are highly allergic to perfume and cologne.

Cell phones, pagers and other electronic devices should be switched off BEFORE the performance. It is impolite and disruptive to the actors and the other audience members to hear a ringing phone or a patron talking on the phone. In addition, please do not leave the theater to take a phone call unless it is an emergency. You will have to climb over several other patrons to exit the seats and will disturb each one of them. Do not text during the performance.

No photography or video taping of any kind is allowed during any performances. It is a disturbance to the performers because photography generates noise which creates a distraction both to audience and performers. The sudden burst of flash photography blinds vision and can endanger the life of the performers on stage. The only photography and recording rights are reserved for archival purpose. It is also against our contractual arrangements with the publishers to allow videotaping and photography. Archival photographs will be available to the company members.

No food or drinks are allowed at any time during a performance or in the theater. Munching and crunching is considered rude and food crumbs, wrappers and soda cans cause a mess in the seats. Unwrap cough drops before the curtain goes up.

Keep feet, bags and patrons out of the aisles; some directors use this space for actors entrances and exits as well as a place to move scenery. It is very dangerous to block the aisles. It is also against the fire code.

Do not put feet on the theater chairs. It makes them dirty and disturbs the people in front of you.

Never throw anything on stage. Items thrown on stage can harm an actor or technician.

THOU SHALT NOT TALK. Discussion and comments that you have about the performance should be left till you leave the theater. Please remain quiet during the show. It is all right to react to the performance but chatting that causes distraction is considered rude.

Some audiences leave the show when it is nearing the end because they want to beat the crowds that are exiting at the same time. It is very disrespectful to the actors and the other patrons for people to get up before the show is over. Please stay seated until the very end.

If you bring a child, make sure etiquette is part of the experience. Children love learning new things.
